MST is a group of dedicated, caring professionals providing support to individuals and families experiencing a behavioral health crisis. We have been responding to crises on location in the community since 2012.

Expanded Response

MST is now able to respond with or without law enforcement when it is safe to do so, and we can transport individuals in crisis when a higher level of care is necessary.

The new MST Crisis Call Center is able to take calls directly from the community.

The Call Center is staffed by MST **24/7.** Staff are able to offer support over the phone and to send a crisis response team to the crisis location when needed.














Participant FAQs about the Sonoma County Coordinated Entry System

1. What is a Coordinated Entry System (CES)?

- Coordinated Entry matches people experiencing homelessness to available housing programs. It prioritizes those who are most in need of assistance.
- Referrals are made only to permanent housing, not shelters.

What is a CES Assessment?

- Used to determine eligibility for referrals to homeless permanent housing services.
- Places you on a centralized By-Names-List so you don't have to apply program by program.
- Includes to the Vulnerability Index Survey (VI-SPDAT), a standard assessment tool used to measure a person's vulnerability and housing needs.
- Matches you with housing services that meet your needs when they are available, although an assessment does not guarantee a referral.

3. What is the Sonoma County Coordinated Entry System By-Name-List?

- The By-Name-List is a list of individuals, families, and transitional age youth who are experiencing homelessness prioritized by vulnerability.
- The By-Name-List is a dynamic waiting list and does not guarantee referrals to any particular service or program.
- The most vulnerable, eligible, and most in need will be connected to available housing programs first.
- If you do not accept the housing referral offered to you, you will maintain your placement on the By-Name-List and will be offered the next eligible referral.
- The By-Name-List is stored in the Homeless Management Information System, which is not accessible to the public.

4. I've completed the CES Assessment. What should I do now?

- Keep your contact and location information up to date with an Access Point
- Stay in contact with a CES Access Point, shelter, or outreach team every 90 days to maintain your active status on the By-Name-List and eligibility for housing referrals.
- Update your CES Assessment annually or when a major life event occurs.
- Continue to pursue other housing options, services, and benefits. Many people who are on the list will NOT be offered a housing opportunity or will wait a very long time for a referral. This is currently due to the lack of housing opportunities.

5. What are my rights as a participant in Sonoma County CES?

- The CES, Access Points and Cooperating Agencies must comply with
 the nondiscrimination provisions of federal civil rights laws, which bar
 discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex,
 actual or perceived sexual orientation or gender identity, disability,
 familial status, marital status, citizenship (or lack thereof).
- Depending on eligibility, cooperating agencies may refer a participant to a more appropriate agency.
- You have the option for your information to be stored on the By-Names-List anonymously, and it can be removed at any time.
- You can register for the Coordinated Entry System regardless of your legal status. Access points and Cooperating Agencies have assistance in Spanish.

6. How do I submit a complaint or grievance?

All emergency shelter/safe sleeping sites below are available seasonally, some pending specific weather conditions. Please contact the agencies below to verify shelter's status, eligibility requirements and intake process. For emergency shelters that are available year-round, please refer to "Sonoma County Emergency Shelter Intake Information" or call 2-1-1 for a list of resources available in your area.

Warming Centers – Winter to Early Spring*

https://socoemergency.org/emergency/warming-centers/

Warming centers are heated public facilities where you and your family can go for relief during periods of extreme cold. Sonoma County works closely with local homeless providers to ensure needs are being met and helps augment with additional resources as needed during freeze alerts.

Warming centers will be activated when a single or combination of the below conditions may prompt activation of this phase:

- Overnight temperatures are expected to drop below 28 degrees, and conditions are projected for a minimum of two consecutive days.
- Overnight temperatures are expected to drop below 32 degrees, and conditions are projected for a minimum of three consecutive days.
- Temperatures predicted to drop below an average nighttime low of **37 degrees** for **two consecutive days** with **accompanying hazardous conditions** including more than 1 inch of rain, predicted snowfall, flash flood watch/warning, wind chills or extreme temperature fluctuations.
- National Weather Service and/or Department of Health issues a Frost Advisory and/or Freeze Watch.
- Overnight low temperatures are accompanied with daytime temperatures of 40 degrees or lower.

Cooling Centers - Late Spring to Mid-Summer*

Cooling centers are air-conditioned public facilities where you and your family can go for relief during extreme heat to prevent or reduce heat-related illness and stress. When the County, cities and partner agencies activate cooling centers during extreme heat events (see criteria below), the facilities will be listed online.

The criteria determining when the county opens a cooling center includes meeting the following conditions:

- National Weather Service issues a Heat Risk Level 3 warning or greater for at least 3 consecutive days
- National Weather Service issues an Excessive Heat Warning
- Forecast of high daytime temperatures accompanied with overnight low temperature of at least 75 degrees or higher.
- California Independent System Operator issues an Energy Emergency Alert 2 or 3 electrical emergency.

^{*}Cooling Centers/Warming Centers subject to seasonal limitations; shelters may be open for days or weeks at a time pending weather conditions but are subject to closure at a moment's notice. For long term shelter/housing solutions, please reach out to your local homeless service providers.

Sonoma County Seasonal Emergency Shelters

Sign Up for Alerts

Sign up for alerts to receive notifications when your local city ordinance declares a public state of emergency related to hazardous conditions in your area. You can use any combination of methods below to stay up-to-date with local alerts and safety information.

SoCoAlert – Upon signing up for SoCoAlert, select to receive alerts through landline calls, cell phone text messages or pre-recorded verbal messages and email. System also works with telephone devices for the deaf.

Nixle – Receive email and text messages from local fire and law enforcement agencies that include public safety messages as well as emergency information.

National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio – This alert system is available for purchase at a relatively low cost. When properly programmed, the National Weather Service can remotely turn on these radios and send basic alerts, including for wildfire. The message may be accompanied by a warning tone, depending on the model of radio you purchase.



1. ¿Qué es un sistema de entrada coordinada (CES)?

- La Entrada Coordinada es un sistema simplificado diseñado para hacer coincidir de manera eficiente a las personas sin hogar con los programas de vivienda disponibles. Da prioridad a los que más necesitan asistencia.
- Las referencias se hacen solo a viviendas permanentes, no a refugios.

2. ¿Qué es una evaluación CES?





Transitions into Housing is a yearlong peer support program that is provided in four phases with the following objectives:

- 1. One-to-one peer support
- 2. Tools for successful housing skills
- 3. Resource referrals for needs
- 4. Experience of success and responsibility
- 5. Community engagement

Eligibility Criteria

- 1) Ability to participate in program activities.
- 2) Willingness to commit to the program.
- 3) Self-identified challenge regarding housing.
- 4) 18 years and older.
- 5) Sonoma County resident

Helpful Definitions

Transition is the process of changing from one state or condition to another.

Peer support is the process through which people who share common experiences or face similar challenges come together as equals to give and receive help based on the knowledge that comes through shared experiences. A peer is an equal, someone with whom one shares demographic or social similarities. Support expresses the kind of deeply felt empathy, encouragement, and assistance that people with shared experiences can offer one another within a reciprocal relationship.

Definiciones útiles

La Transición es el proceso de cambiar de un estado o condición a otro.

El apoyo entre pares es el proceso a través del cual las personas que comparten experiencias comunes o enfrentan desafíos similares se unen como iguales para dar y recibir ayuda basada en el conocimiento que surge de las experiencias compartidas. Un par es un igual, alguien con quien uno comparte similitudes demográficas o sociales. El apoyo expresa el tipo de empatía, aliento y asistencia profunda que las personas con experiencias compartidas pueden ofrecerse unas a otras dentro de una relación recíproca.
